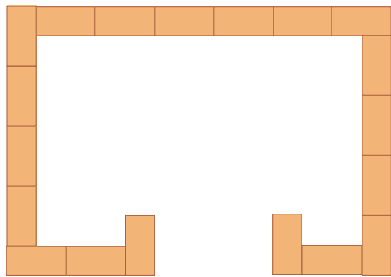
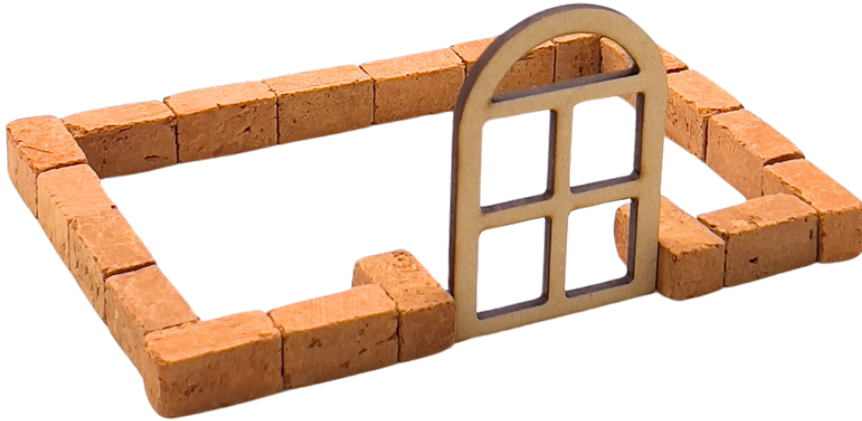
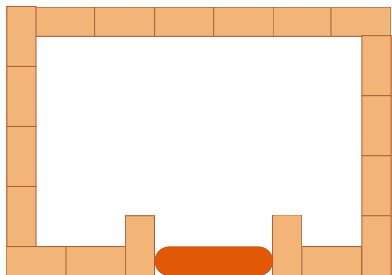


Brickhouse Layout

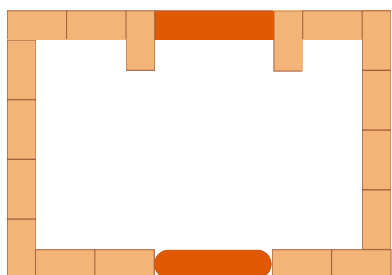


Place the bricks as shown on a cardboard or a flat board & play around. Do not glue them yet. This is the base layer. Leave a gap of 2 bricks for the door.



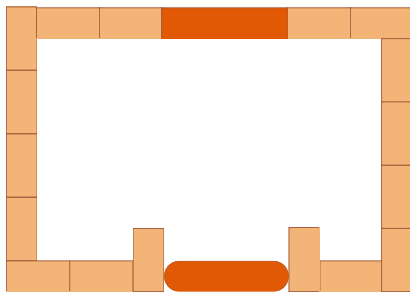
Layer 1

Position the door as illustrated below, making sure there is no gap between the door and the bricks. After the bricks are arranged, apply glue to the bottom & to the sides. Press firmly.



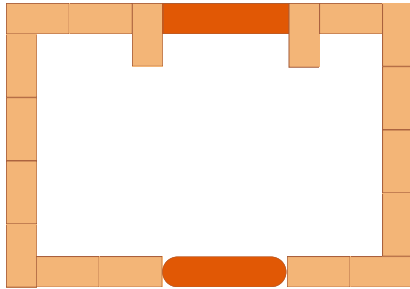
Layer 2

Place the bricks as shown (**layer 2**) along with the window. The window is 2 bricks long as well. **The bricks alternate on every layer. This arrangement gives strength.**



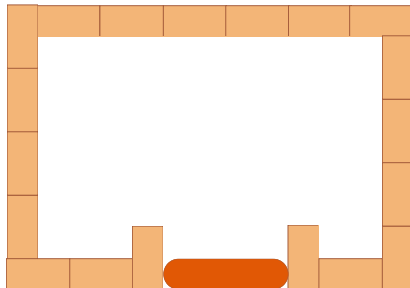
Glue the bricks as shown in **layer 3**. It is same as layer 1.

Next is layer 4. Practice is key to aligning them well. Layers 2, 4, 6 have the same placement of bricks.

Layer 4



This is **layer 5**. The top part of the window is covered by bricks for a neat look

Layer 5

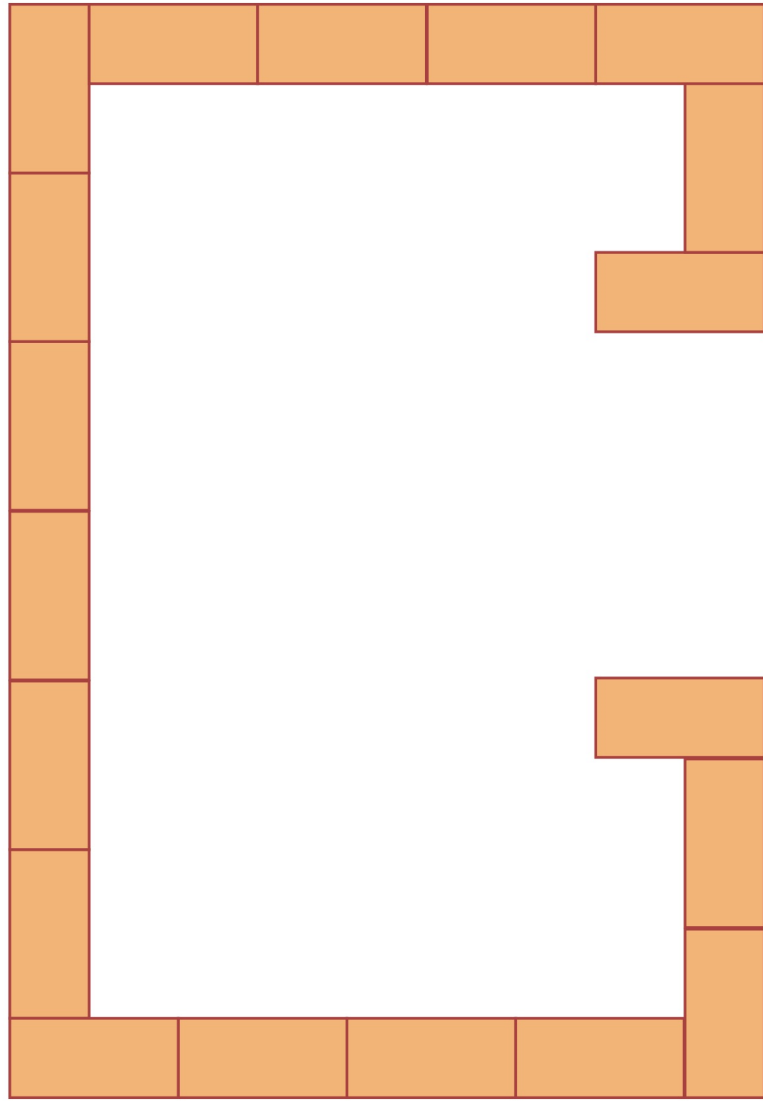
Wait for the entire model to dry before moving it.

Construct a roof using ice cream sticks by placing them side by side and binding them with tape from the bottom. Alternatively, use a V-shaped cardboard for the roof.

Or, use the house as a desk accessory for storage.
